Subject: Veterans Administration Proposal to Expand Veterans Access to Quality Healthcare, Help Reduce Wait Times

To expand Veterans access to quality healthcare and help reduce wait times, the U.S. Department of Veterans Affairs has published a proposed rule extending what it defines as Full Practice Authority to Advanced Practice Registered Nurses (APRNs) serving in the Veterans Health Administration (VHA), triggering a 60-day public comment period ending on July 25, 2016.

The VHA proposal appears here and was published in the *Federal Register* on May 25. The rule protects Veteran patient safety, defines Full Practice Authority within the VHA system and its facilities, and defines an APRN as a person who has successfully completed an accredited graduate-level educational program in one of the four distinct APRN roles (Certified Nurse Practitioner, Certified Registered Nurse Anesthetist, Clinical Nurse Specialist, and Certified Nurse-Midwife), has passed a national certification exam, and possesses licensure in a state.

The proposal is consistent with the recommendations of the <u>National Academy of Medicine</u>, the <u>congressionally mandated Independent Assessment of the VA</u>, and current policy in the Army, Navy, Air Force, Forward Surgical Teams, and Indian Health Service health systems.

We urge you to support the VHA proposed rule by contacting the Secretary of Veterans Affairs, <u>submitting a public comment</u>, and cosponsoring <u>S 2279</u> / <u>HR 1247</u> / <u>HR 4134</u>. We also ask House members to oppose and not sign a Benishek-Brownley Dear Colleague letter attacking this proposal.
